
STAFF UPDATES


RETURNING STAFF

FLU VACCINE

Getting your flu shot from April gives you your best chance of avoiding the flu.

Influenza vaccines will be available from April 1st. Getting vaccinated helps protect our community during flu season (May to September) and particularly safeguards vulnerable individuals. While early vaccination ensures you don't miss out, protection decreases over time. Therefore, we recommend getting your flu shot at the optimal time for effectiveness.

METHYLPHENIDATE

NATIONAL SUPPLY ISSUES

There are currently national supply chain issues affecting methylphenidate medications. You may experience:

- Unavailability of your usual brand.
- Delays in stock arrival at pharmacies.
- Temporary availability of some products.

Different extended-release brands may affect individuals differently. Please discuss any changes with your prescriber.

If your usual pharmacy cannot fill your prescription:

- Try other pharmacies (though shortages affect all of New Zealand).
- Contact your prescriber or email prescriptions@gpcare.co.nz if you cannot locate your medication after checking multiple pharmacies.
- Note that new prescriptions cannot be transferred between pharmacies.

Please remember that pharmacists and doctors are not responsible for medication shortages. Pharmac is working to improve the situation.
